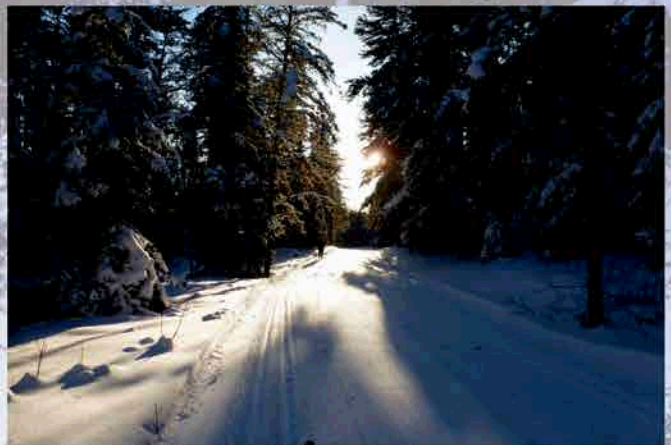

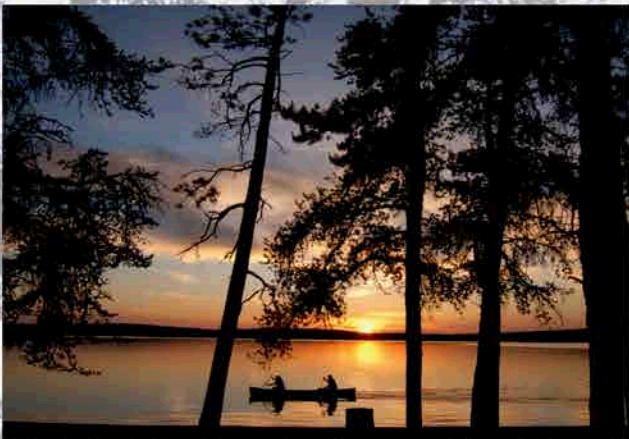

The Dryden Regional Airport is located approximately 5 miles north east of the City of Dryden in Zealand Township. Runway 12-30 is 6000ft long by 150ft wide with high intensity edge lighting.

The Instrument Landing System (ILS) is owned and operated by Nav Canada and is the only ILS between Winnipeg and Thunder Bay. This provides all aircraft and airlines the ability to use the Dryden Regional Airport as an alternate airport during flight planning.

Scheduled passenger service is provided by Bearskin Airlines. The airport is home to The Ministry of Natural Resources Fire Management Centre, Discovery Air Fire Services, GSH Helicopters, Hydro One Helicopters based within the Discovery Air hangar, Northern Youth Programs, Kasper Aviation and National Car rentals.

The Dryden Regional Airport has a contracted Fixed Base Operator (FBO) Morgan Aviation that provides all fuelling services for Avgas and Jet Fuel. Ground handling and de-icing services are provided by David Wessel.

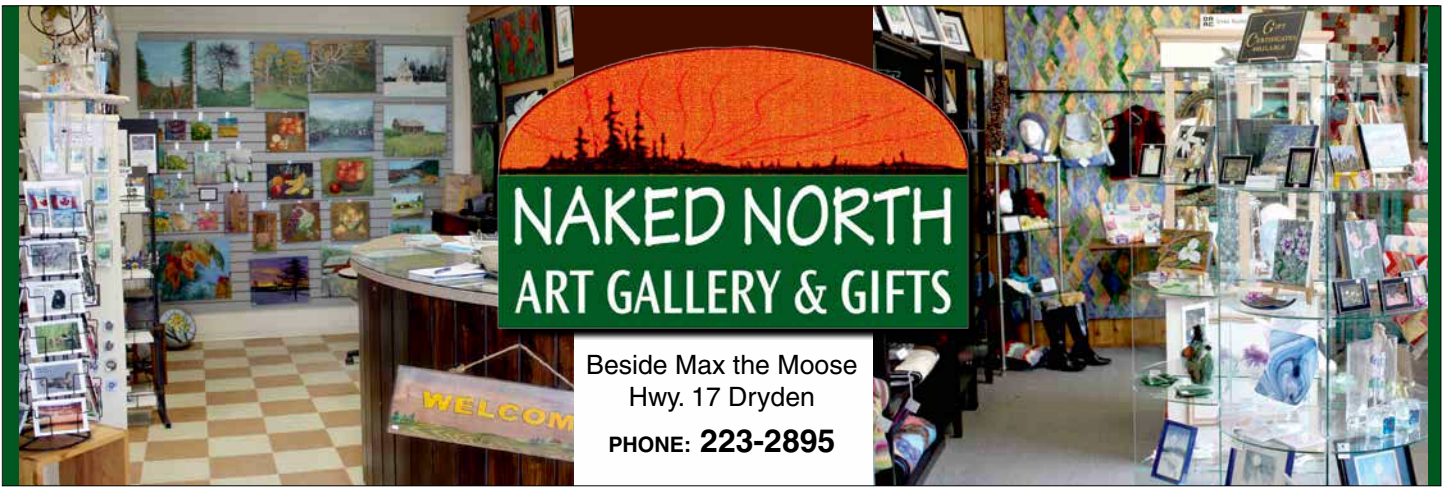

The museum features four galleries on two floors with an area of 4000 square feet. There are over 10,000 artifacts, permanent and rotating displays, and a research library.

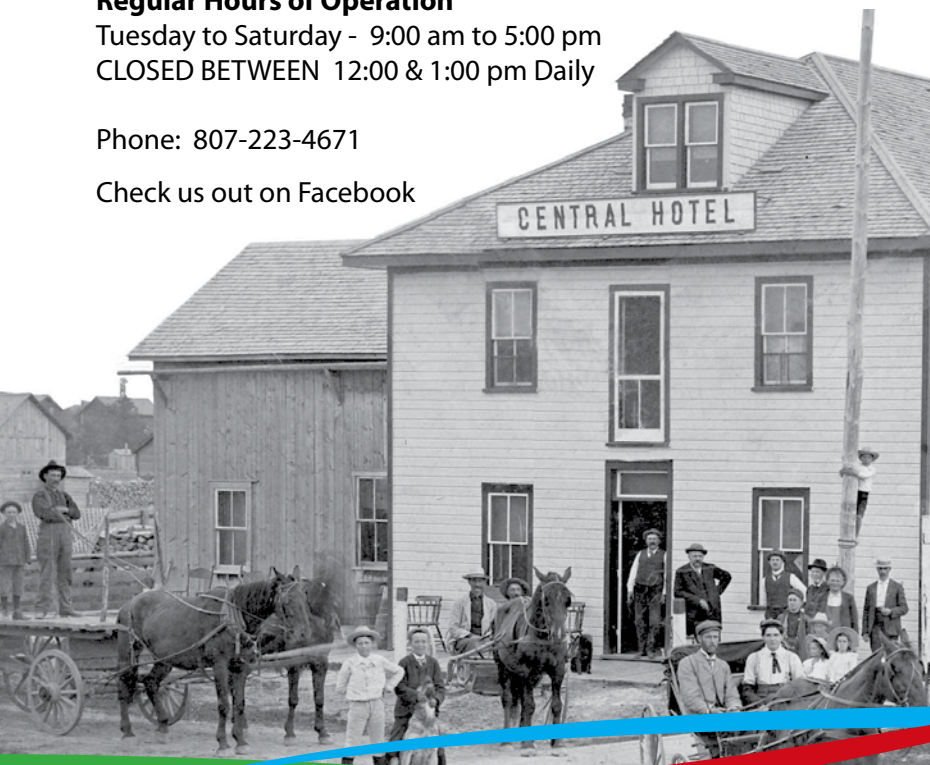

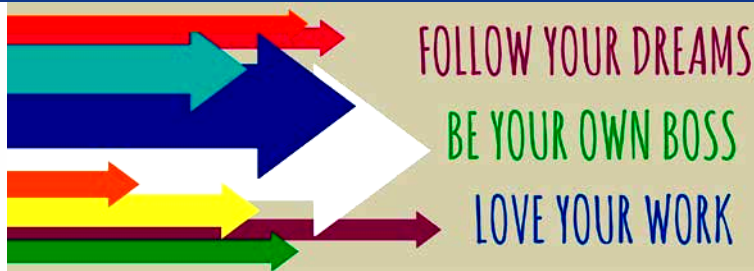

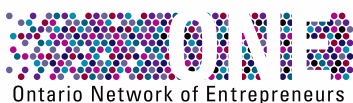

## PULP MILL

Domtar Dryden produces Northern Bleached Softwood Kraft (NBSK). This notably clean and strong pulp from the Dryden mill is used in the production of a variety of consumer products such as paper towel and tissue items, packaging and labels, as well as printing, publishing and copy paper.

The mill employs 350 people and has an annual production of 325,000 air dried metric tons. The annual fiber consumption is 1.8 million cubic meters of wood.

### IN THE COMMUNITY

Domtar makes an effort to support the local community. Through long-standing programs and ongoing partnerships, we focus our community investments on initiatives that support literacy, health, wellness and sustainability. We also have an emphasis on projects that are focused on youth and regional First Nations.



### FORESTLANDS

Domtar is responsible for the management of two sustainable forest licenses on behalf of the Province of Ontario. The annual harvest of each of these forests averages less than 1% of the total licensed forest area.

Trout Lake Forest	1,000,000 hectares	< 2,300 hectares (3 yr avg.)



Approximately fifty percent of the fibre supply for the Dryden Mill comes from these license areas. The additional 50% is comprised of purchased fibre from other nearby license areas.

Domtar has an active renewal program to ensure the forests we manage are regenerated. This involves aerial seeding, natural regeneration, and the planting of seedlings. In 2015, the Trout Lake and Wabigoon Forests had a renewal program that saw approximately 3,600 hectares planted with 5,100,000 seedlings.

Domtar's commitment to sustainable forest management is one of the cornerstones of our business strategy. We further demonstrate this commitment through independent third-party forest certification which verifies that the products we produce originate from sustainable and responsibly managed forests.

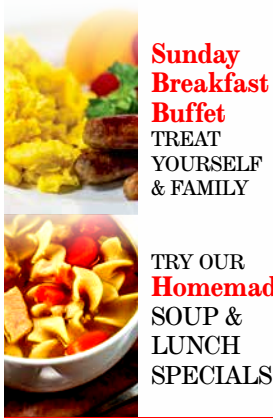

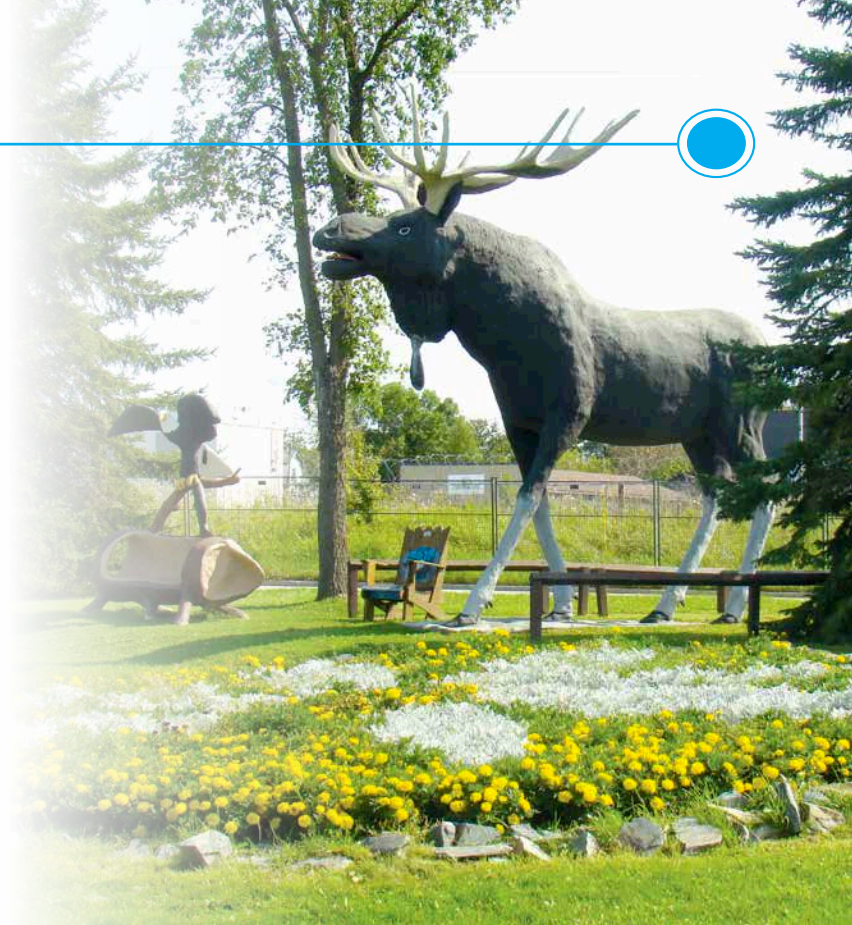

# LAURA HOWE MARSH

Enjoy the amazing variety of flora and fauna featured in the Laura Howe Marsh. Wetlands are home to a wider variety of wildlife than any other Ontario habitat. The best habitats are found in marshes that have a mix of open water and emerging plants.

The marsh provides a spawning and nursery area for fish and amphibians, a winter refuge for deer and songbirds, and a rich food source for beavers and hunters such as snakes, fox, and birds of prey.

Walk the short loop, which is 0.4 km in length, takes approximately twenty minutes or the long loop, which is 2 km in length and takes approximately one hour. Sturdy shoes are advisable. Don't forget to dress appropriately for the weather. During the fly season from May to early August, insect repellent is also recommended. Enjoy your wetland adventure!

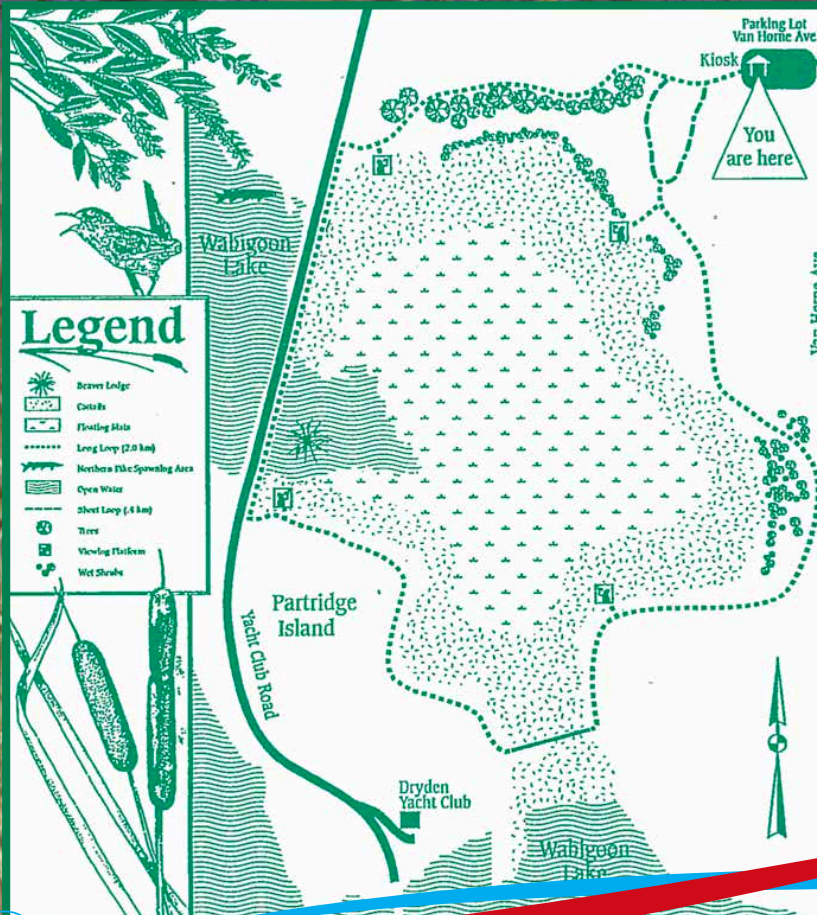

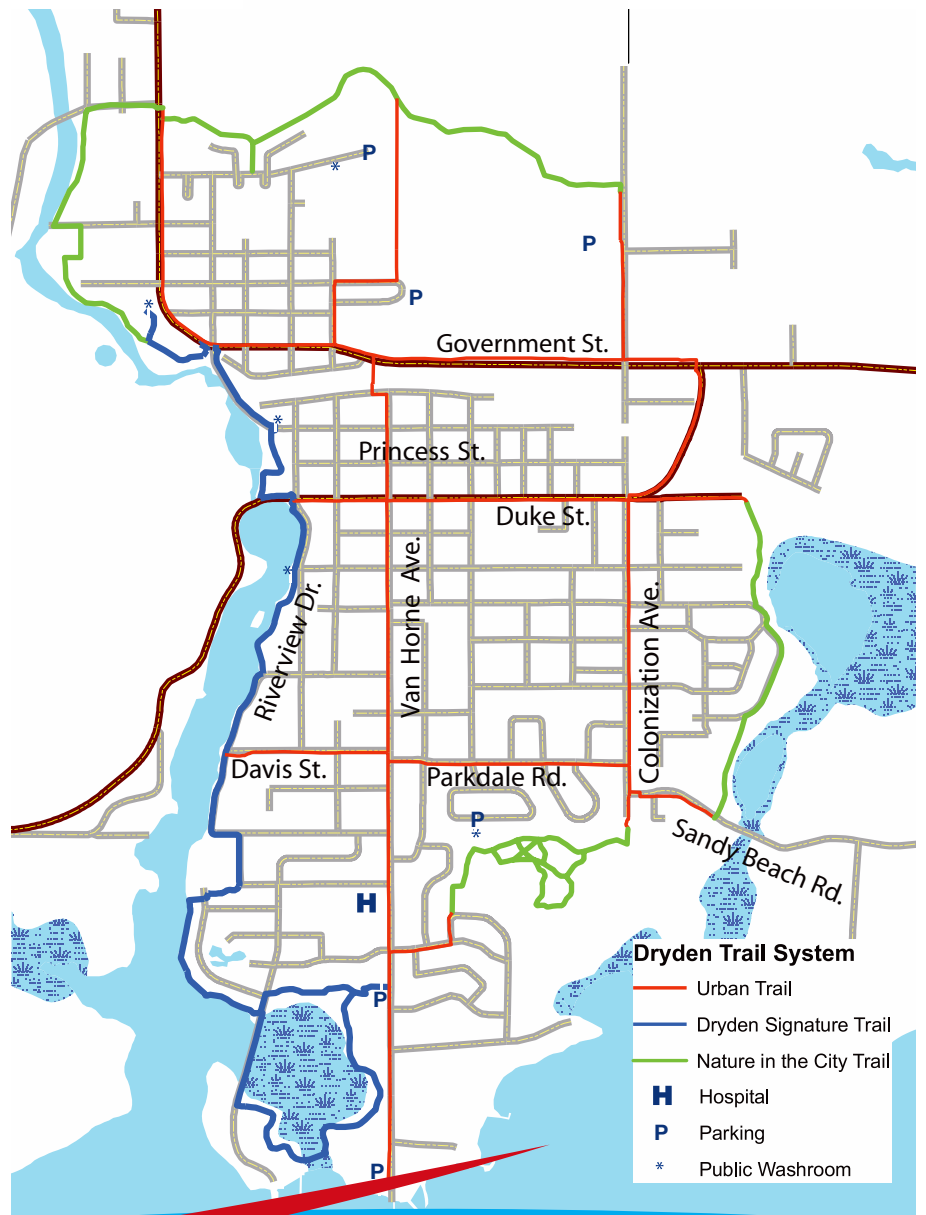
## DRYDEN SIGNATURE TRAIL - BLUE 5.4 KM

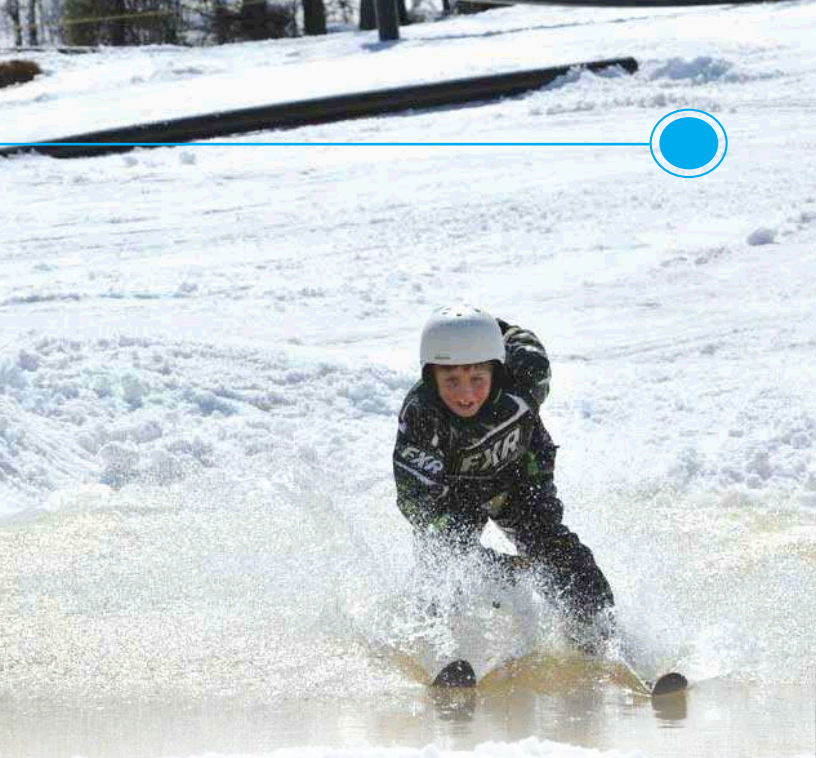
The Dryden Signature Trail System consists of two trail routes, uniquely designed to provide hands-on, engaging, intriguing, recreational/interpretative encounters to capture the imagination of community residents and visitors. The Signature Trail route follows along the Wabigoon River from Johnston Park located on the Trans Canada Highway 17 to the Laura Howe Marsh located off Van Horne Avenue. Wetlands are nature's richest domains. Neither land nor lake, wetlands weave together elements of earth and water to create unique habitats within the boreal forest.

Wetlands are always "on the edge". The Laura Howe Marsh is 2.0 km and an excellent example of life "on the edge of the forest and on the edge of the lake". Creatures of both worlds come to the marsh for water, food or shelter. The marsh is an oasis for the animals of the forest and a nursery for small creatures in the lake.

## THE NATURE IN THE CITY TRAIL - GREEN 6.8 KM

The Nature in the City Trail System is a beautiful "necklace" of trails that link together all the aesthetic, natural areas surrounding the city core. The rich assembly of natural settings and rich wetlands is the City's most valuable outdoor recreational attribute and asset. The "necklace" provides excellent opportunities for short or extended walking/hiking/jogging or cycling and skiing. The trail accommodates multiple use walking, jogging and strolling and that serves as a cross-country ski route in the winter months. This trail is a rich assembly of natural areas surrounding the City.

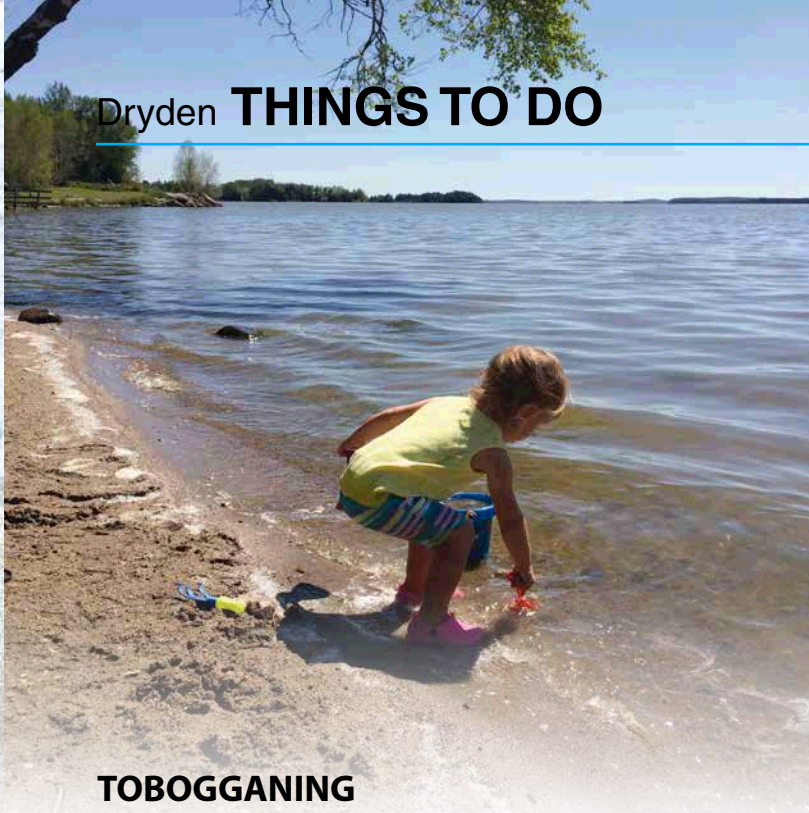

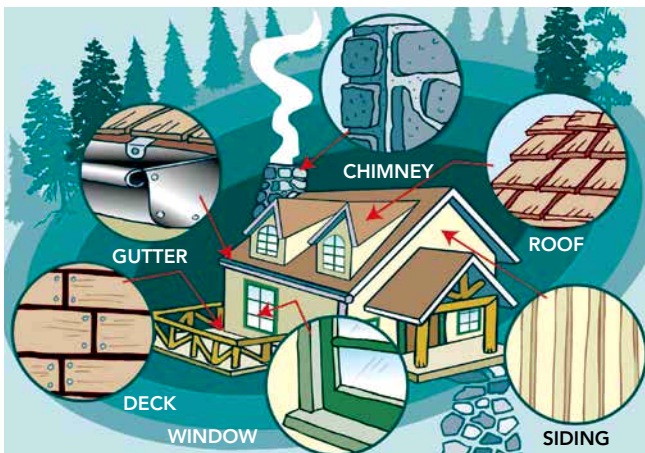

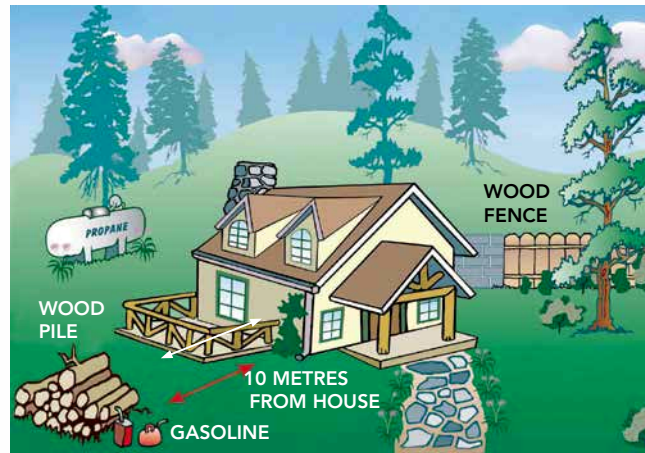

- Fuel, paint and other flammable items properly stored in outbuilding
- Skirting around the base of buildings and decks
- Area surrounding buildings is relatively free of combustible materials
- Trees pruned to create vertical separation from the ground
- Trees thinned out creating good horizontal separation
- Clearly visible sign indicating house number at the entrance to the property

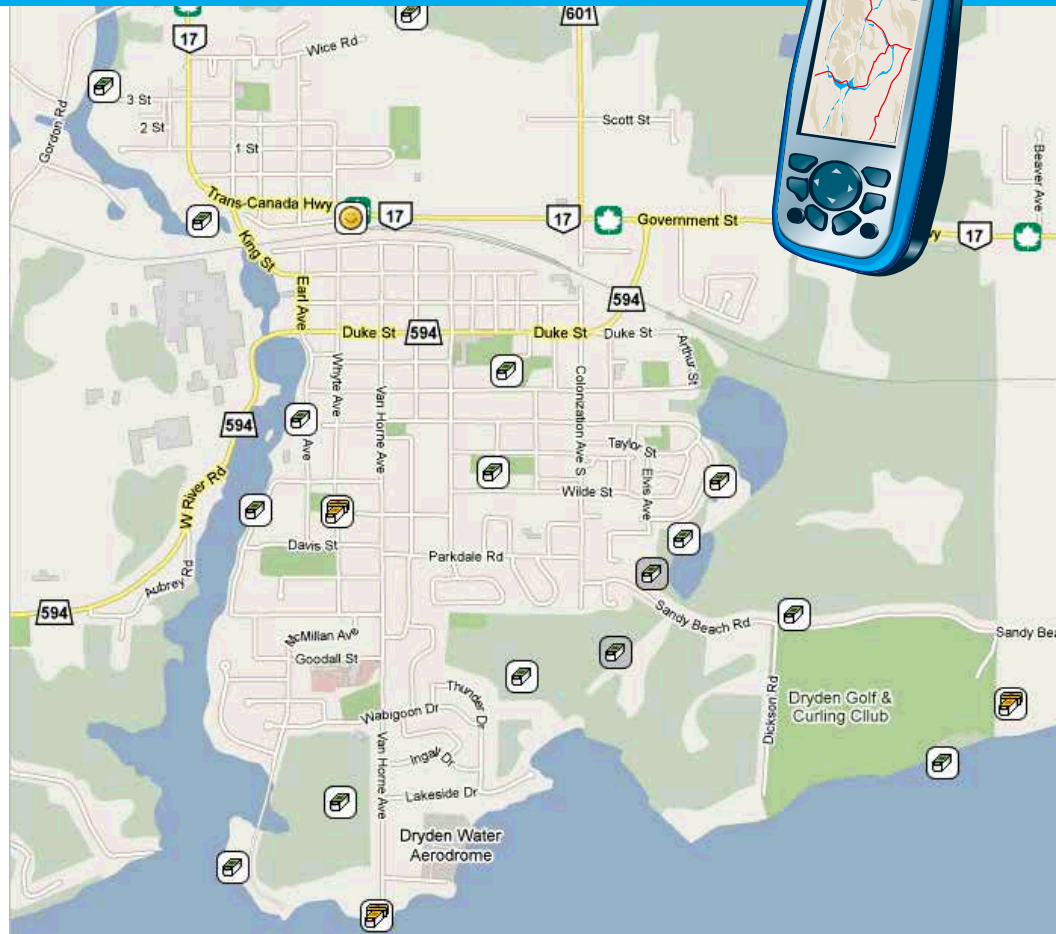

## Make Your Dryden You-Nique!

New Prospect School Grade 6's

Project began February 2016 and ended with a celebratory visit to admire the brochure display at the visitor information centre in June. The class, teachers, information centre staff, and Councillor MacKinnon enjoyed a 'Dryden Jeopardy' game challenge with Councillor MacKinnon coming in a close second!

As part of a grade 6 social studies unit, the grade 6 class has been investigating if a small city like Dryden can have an impact on how others view Canada, as many of the students believe that Dryden is 'too small', there is "nothing to do", and "few people would want to know about us" to actually visit. As a result, we have asked the students to start investigating if Dryden could be considered unique, what in Dryden might stand out as a 'unique part of Canada' and how deeply do they actually know their community to actually form an opinion.

As an end task the students want to create "itineraries" for tourists visiting Dryden - in essence plan out "a special day or 2-3 day plans" per season for tourists - and want to market their itineraries to specific target groups. To embark on their investigation the students have identified places they can actually visit and learn, as well as people they can contact with their questions to see if they will either be available to visit the class, or to answer their questions via email. Thus far the students will be visiting: The Dryden Museum, Egli's Sheep Farm, Kokum's Bannock Shack, The Naked North Art Gallery, and will be working with one of Dryden's naturalists and exploring Laura Howe Marsh from a winter perspective. Class visitors will be Bonnie Skene from Domtar, Larry Meadows from Walleye Masters, Marc McNay from TV show "The Real Deal", Ocean Barkman from the Dryden Native Friendship Centre, Suzanne Joly from Winterfest committee, Mr. VanKougnet- local trapper, Mr. Burton- dog sledder, Mr. Woodworth (kite skiing and wind surfing), Samantha Hawkins from Farmer's market and local



Food Co-op, and DDC. The students will also be researching online places like Fort Vermilion, Fat biking/mountain biking, kayaking, 2 provincial parks, Chris Pronger connection to Dryden, etc).

At the beginning of this project, the students "didn't believe" that their work and thoughts would be actually considered and used in the community as "they are just kids". Their teachers advocated for community partners to try and teach/ show by example to the students that they are the "future" and that expressing an interest in their community needs to start to happen and is very important for the well-being of Dryden.

## Dryden Police Service MARCH BREAK YOUTH CAMP



This year was the first year for the Dryden Police Service to offer a March Break Youth Camp. With donations from numerous sources including the Northwestern Health Unit, Gould's Brandsource, Dryden Area Violence Prevention Committee, Northern Horizons, and Pharmasave. This camp consisted of 20 participants from grades 5-8 from all area schools and provided an opportunity to experience healthy activities during the March break. The participants took part in laser tag, bowling, dog sledding, gym activities, trapping instruction / demonstration, Geocaching and ice fishing. They also had the opportunity to experience some local dining at the Hong Kong House, Dryden Go Getters Activity Centre, and Masala Restaurant. This camp aims to leave a positive imprint on community youth by boosting their self confidence to try new activities and providing leadership skills.

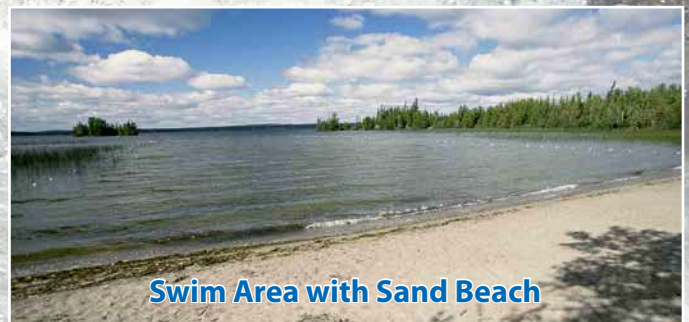
